## €500k European Funding to Support the Fight Against Cybercrime

The Institute has secured €500,000 to develop a virtual training environment supporting law enforcement agencies, judicial authorities and the private sector in the fight against cybercrime.

Dynamic Forensics Evaluation and Training (DFET) will create, deliver and assess a range of investigation challenges focussed on areas including financial fraud, illegal use of the internet and distribution of contraband material.

DFET commences in January 2014 and includes academic and industrial Partners from Ireland, Slovenia and Sweden. DFET is part funded by the European Union's Prevention of and Fight against Crime Programme.
